Remembering 9/11

The City of Show Low, in conjunction with the Show Low Unified School District, is sponsoring a memorial service to honor those who lost their lives on September 11, 2001. The service will be held on Wednesday, September 11, 2002 beginning at 5:48 a.m. at Show Low High School auditorium. The starting time coincides with the exact minute the first tower of the World Trade Center in New York City was attacked last year. A short program will feature speeches by Mayor Gene Kelley, Show Low Police Chief John Corder and Show Low Fire Chief Ben Owens. In addition, there will be musical offerings from the Show Low High School band and Show Low High School chorus. The memorial service is free and open to the public.

Get out and vote in the Primary!

September 10, 2002 is Primary Election Day. Since this is a statewide election, Show Low voters must go to one of four polling places, assigned by Navajo County based on your residence location (either City Hall, the Fire Department, Show Low High School auditorium or the National Guard Armory). The polls open at 6 a.m. and close at 7 p.m. If you have questions about your voter registration or polling place, contact the City Clerk's office at 532-4060 and we will call the Navajo County Elections Department for assistance. If you prefer, you may contact the County in Holbrook directly at (928) 524-4062.

Please remember that if you are a registered voter with one of the three recognized parties—Democrat, Republican or Libertarian—you must vote your party's ballot. However, this is an open Primary, which means that any voter who didn't select a party preference may opt to vote any one of the three party ballots. If you choose not to vote in the Primary Election, you are still eligible to vote in the General Election.

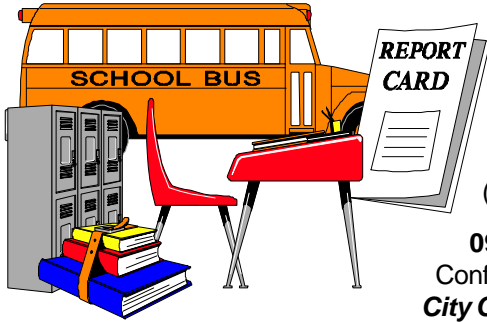
The General Election ballot in November, again featuring statewide candidates, will include two recall elections for incumbent City Councilmen Kenneth King and Bob Williams.

Development Update

The Planning and Zoning department provides information on conditional use permits (CUPs), subdivisions, zoning requests and major projects within the City of Show Low.

Conditional Use Permits

- ✓ The Office Market – This CUP to operate an office furniture store at 861 E. Cooley was granted by the Planning and Zoning Commission in August 2002.

Subdivisions

- ✓ Bison Ridge – The developer plans to construct a phased, mixed-use (residential and commercial) development on 148 acres north of Fairway Park and west of Clark Road (SR260). The property was rezoned from MH (mobile home) to PUD (Planned Unit Development). The preliminary plat for phase 1 consists of 49 residential lots.
- ✓ Fullhouse Estates – This 43-lot subdivision, restricted to site-built homes, is located at the northwest corner of W.

Old Linden Road and N. First Avenue. Construction of infrastructure improvements has begun.

Major Projects

- ✓ Davis Building – Remodeling the front facade and stairway continues on this building located on the Deuce of Clubs.
- ✓ Day & Sons – A building permit has been issued to construct a new concrete batch plant on US60 across from the National Guard armory.
- ✓ Horne Auto – Construction continues on exterior building improvements and a three-bay car wash rack in this auto dealership across from Kmart on the Deuce of Clubs.
- ✓ Meals on Wheels Facility/Senior Center – The City of Show Low and Rural America Assisted Living Facilities, Inc. are developing an approximately 4,500-square-foot facility at 301 W. McNeil (behind Calvary Baptist Church) for use by the Meals on Wheels program and Show Low seniors. The facility will include a commercial kitchen, dining area and multipurpose rooms.
