Fifth annual Project Clean Sweep

Now's the time to clean out your closets, spruce up your house, rake those pine needles and clean up your yard. The City of Show Low is again sponsoring the annual community-wide cleanup and beautification program, "Project Clean Sweep." This year's program includes a variety of services in April, May and June to beautify our city and help residents clean up their properties. Proof of Show Low residency is required to participate in the program. Citizens must show either a current utility statement or a valid driver's license listing a street address.

❑ **Volunteer cleanup.** City of Show Low employees volunteered to clean the Deuce of Clubs and the downtown area in late April, removing weeds and debris.

❑ **"Cash for Trash."** Residents will be paid cash for delivering large, unwanted items to a City facility.

❑ **Free excess garbage collection.** The City has contracted with Waste Management to pick up excess trash at no additional charge to residents.

❑ **Free bulky item pickup service.** Residents can sign up for this free service provided by City employees.

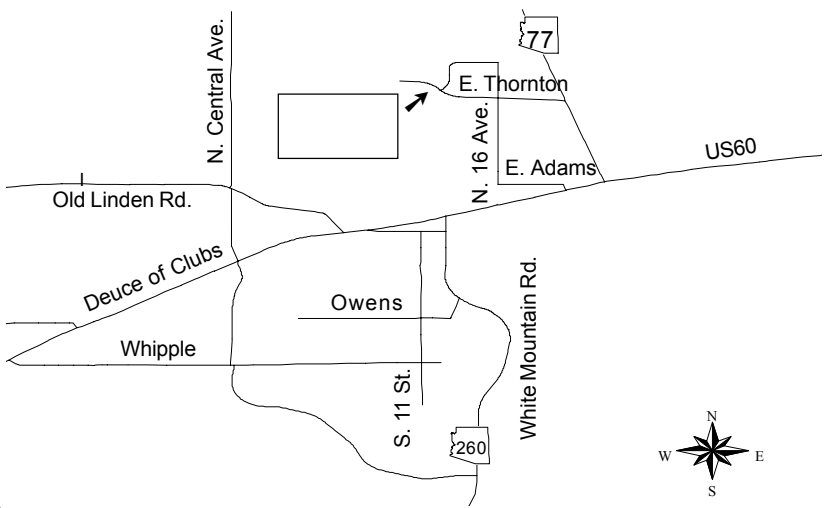
❑ **Dumpster placement.** Dumpsters will be placed at City Hall and the Elks Lodge for use by residents.

"Cash for Trash" is scheduled for Saturday, May 17, 2003. Residents may take large items for disposal to the building next to the City's Public Works yard at 1281 East Thornton. You will be paid cash for each item

accepted. (A list of items and prices is shown below, but no commercial waste items will be accepted.)

Automobile tires will also be taken, although residents will receive no money in return. Each customer is limited to a maximum of eight tires.

The City will accept inoperable vehicles and pay \$25 for those with titles and \$15 for those without titles. The City will provide free towing, but advance reservations must be made with Jon Olson at 532-4051.

Free excess garbage collection will be provided the week of June 2 through 6, 2003, a quarterly service contracted by the City with Waste Management. Only those residents who are billed for City water and/or sewer services receive this benefit. Waste Management will collect excess trash bags under 50 pounds each and items up to four feet long (that must be bound if there's more than one item), placed next to the polycarts on a resident's normally scheduled pickup day.

For those residents who have not participated in the "Cash for Trash" program but have unwanted, heavy items to get rid of, the City offers **free bulky item pickup service**. It is scheduled for June 9 through 14, 2003. City employees will visit households that have made an appointment with Jon Olson at 532-4051. Please include your name, address and telephone number if you leave a message.

Dumpsters will be placed at City Hall on Cooley and the Elks Lodge on Whipple from June 12 through 14, 2003.
