City plans upcoming public works projects

You'll soon be seeing crews resurfacing roads with slurry seal within the City of Show Low. The City sets aside funds every year for maintaining and improving streets. This year, the annual project begins the middle of September and should be completed by mid-October. In some areas, entire streets within a subdivision will be resurfaced.

Streets are carefully chosen as candidates for slurry sealing. Slurry seal maintenance dramatically extends pavement life. Although untreated asphalt pavement is still adequate after several years of use, pavement deterioration has already begun. Roads that are failing structurally are excluded because there is usually damage under the pavement and slurry-sealing won't be effective.

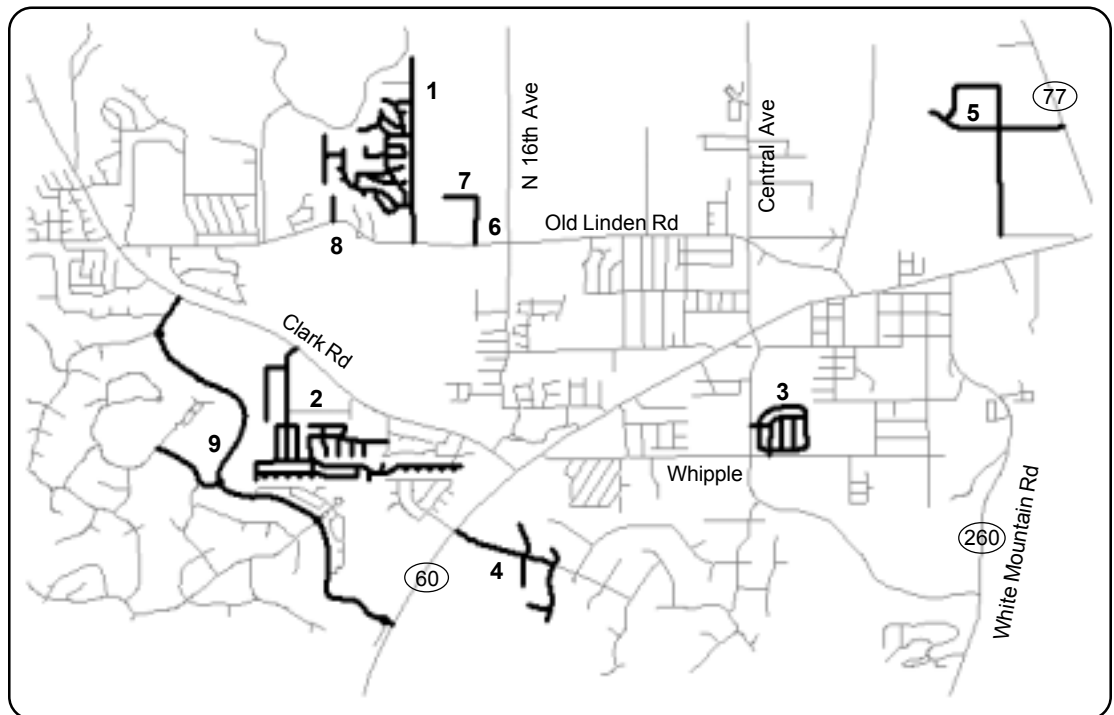
Area residents will be notified 24 to 48 hours in advance via a door hanger that their roads will be resurfaced. The streets will be closed one lane at a time to allow for traffic flow for approximately four hours. The following streets and subdivisions are scheduled for slurry sealing. Please note the

projects are not listed in the order in which they'll be done. Match the numbers below with those shown on the map.

Format: Pick your own four-person scramble team

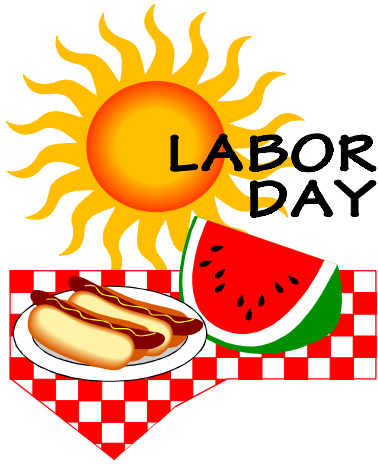

Other public works projects planned for fiscal year 2004 (July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004) include:

- ◆ Completing two additional production water wells. This will bring the total number of wells to six, which will produce 4.5 million gallons of water a day. For comparison, the current peak usage during the summer is 2.4 million gallons per day.
- ◆ Selecting a site for a new production water well, which would be Show Low's seventh well. Because wells are taken out of service periodically for maintenance, additional wells are a backup to ensure adequate water supplies are available. The new well will produce 1.5 million gallons of water daily.
- ◆ Assessing the relocation of water and sewer lines under Show Low Creek bridge. The lines will be relocated in 2005 prior to the Arizona Department of Transportation rebuilding Show Low Creek bridge in 2006.
- ◆ Planting more vegetation in the wetlands that serve the wastewater treatment plant in April or May 2004.
- ◆ Building another mile of the Show Low Creek wastewater collection trunk line from 9th Street to the south side of the Deuce of Clubs near the Show Low Creek bridge. There will be lane closures along the Deuce of Clubs for two to three weeks in late spring 2004.
- ◆ Designing two miles of City streets for complete reconstruction. Some of Show Low's roads are over 40 years old and in dire need of improvement. The streets will be completely torn out and rebuilt with curbing, gutters and sidewalks. The priority for total reconstruction is based on the road's structural failure. Streets that have been rebuilt under this program are portions of Old Linden Road (between 10th and 16th Avenues, between Central and 8th Avenues and from 32nd Avenue to Clark Road) and 24th Street and Hunt.

Reminder! Free excess trash pickup

The next **FREE excess trash week** is September 8 through 12, 2003. This is your opportunity to clean your property of pine needles, leaves, and other debris. Garbage bags under 50 pounds and items no longer than four feet long (bound if there's more than one item) will be accepted. Move the garbage bags and items to the right-of-way next to your polycart on your regular trash pickup day. Only Show Low residents who are billed for City water and/or sewer services are eligible for this benefit. Anyone with questions should call City Hall at 532-4000 during regular business hours.
