Upcoming September events feature a rodeo and celebrity golf tournaments

Bulls & Broncs Rodeo

The first is an old-fashioned rodeo on Friday, September 1, and Saturday, September 2, 2006. Take the kids and hoot and holler for your favorite cowboy at the **Bulls & Broncs Rodeo**, an official stop on the 2006 "Great American Tour." Brought to the White Mountains by Show Low Main Street, all events begin at 7:30 p.m. at the Vacation Village Arena, 4599 South White Mountain Road.

Watch top rodeo cowboys from across the U.S. match their skills against the rankest bulls and horses around in bareback riding, saddle bronc riding and bull riding. Novice bull riders are invited to participate. Admission is \$10 per adult, \$6 for seniors and students and children 6 and under are free. Celebrity Golf Tournament

Play in a celebrity golf tournament and help our youth through benefiting the programs of the Show Low Youth Recreation and Sports Foundation. The **2006 Celebrity Golf Tournament** will be held Saturday, September 9, 2006, at Torreón Golf Club. Join foundation spokesman *Matt Williams*, retired third baseman for the Arizona Diamondbacks, and *Danny White*, retired Dallas Cowboy and former manager of the Arizona Rattlers, as they tee off. Other avid supporters include PGA professional Billy Mayfair, ESPN Radio host Roy Garibaldi, former Phoenix Sun and current Suns announcer Tim Kempton and retired San Francisco Giant Jason Christiansen.

Check-in and registration runs from 8 to 8:45 a.m. and will feature an informal celebrity autograph session. Bring your item to be autographed. Shotgun start begins at 9 a.m. Pick your own four-person scramble team. Individual entrants will be assigned to a team.

The \$150 per person entry fee includes green fees, a cart, range balls, a polo-style shirt, a post-tournament awards luncheon and prizes after your round of golf. Two team mulligans, for a total \$60, are allowed. One mulligan may be used on the front nine and one on the back nine. An optional team buy-in is \$100 per team. Men will play from the white tee boxes and women from the red tee boxes. Handicaps will be assigned based on individual handicaps within each team.

Tournament entry forms are available by calling John Haverland at 537-5320. Entry deadline is September 5 or when the first 30 teams have paid and been assigned.

Online services provide citizens more convenience

Citizens and visitors to the City's website at www.ci.show-low.az.us will see new information and services online, most of them added and updated by the Administrative Services department. These convenient features allow the online viewer to browse and pay, if necessary, without leaving home.

A new service allows citizens to check their utility accounts and pay their bills online. From any page within the website, click on the "Utility Payment" link at the top. Set up your online account by entering your customer number and name as it appears on the utility bill. You can view your account balance and then pay it online. You may choose to make a one-time payment or automatically charge the balance to a credit card every billing cycle a balance is due. You can select which day of the month your account should be charged, but make sure it is at least three days prior to your bill's due date or you may be charged a late fee. Billing will occur on or shortly after the date selected.

For information on a variety of finance-related topics, select "Departments" at the top of the website's home page, then select "Administrative Services." You'll find Quick Links available under the "Finance" heading showing sales tax rates, the annual financial report and the budget. Under the heading of "Utilities," links include water districts, the electric district, trash pickup routes and an application for utility service.

In addition, the monthly newsletter is available online. Because the City's billing service is handled by an outside contractor, you may want to read the newsletter before receiving your statement in the mail. From the home page, select "Newsletters" and then choose the newsletter of your choice.

Grants available for emergency housing repairs

Low-income homeowners may be eligible for emergency repairs to their property. The Limited Housing Repair Program, sponsored by the Northern Arizona Council of Governments (NACOG), has applications available for health- and safety-related repairs. Mobile homes are eligible if the land on which the mobile is located is owned by the homeowner. Preference is given to low-income households, the elderly and households with residents who are disabled. Because of limited funds and high demand, not all projects can be funded immediately. Applications may be placed on a waiting list and approved as funding becomes available.
