## Project Clean Sweep continues

The free citywide beautification program, Project Clean Sweep, ends in June. Proof of City of Show Low residency is required to participate. Construction materials are strictly prohibited. Project Clean Sweep is comprised of five components, most of which are completed or currently in process, but residents can still participate in the dumpster drop. ### Free Excess Trash Collection

Waste Management provided free excess garbage collection May 28 through June 1, a quarterly service. **The next collections are August 27 through 31 and October 22 through 26.** Only residents billed for City water and/or sewer services are eligible. On your normally scheduled pickup day,

Waste Management will collect excess trash bags under 50 pounds each and items up to four feet long (bound if there is more than one item), placed next to the polycart.

### Free Bulky Item Pickup

Residents who scheduled a pickup by the **May 29** deadline must place all bulky items (appliances, furniture, tires, etc.) next to the curb in front of the residence. City employees will collect the items **June 4 through 8** from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The City will not accept hazardous materials, including liquid paints, oils, pesticides, herbicides and household cleaning products. If you did not schedule a pickup, items left for disposal will incur a charge of \$50 per item, added to your July 2007 utility bill.

### Abandoned Vehicles

Residents who submitted the required forms by **May 31** will have their inoperable vehicles towed by Show Low Auto.

### Dumpster Drop

Residents may dump their refuse for free **June 4 through 9, 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.** at the Lone Pine Transfer Station, located off of SR77. **Bring proof of City of Show Low residency (use your water/sewer/garbage bill).** Those unable to prove Show Low residency will be charged the full dumping fee. Unacceptable items include construction site debris and materials and other commercial refuse; hazardous materials including pesticides, herbicides, oils, liquid paints, household cleaning products; automobile batteries; and tires with rims.

## Deuce of Clubs road project

Motorists are advised that beginning June 25, the Arizona Department of Transportation will be milling and overlaying the Deuce of Clubs from SR260 (Clark Road) to the Show Low Regional Airport entrance. Work on the project, estimated to take four weeks, will be done at night from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Prior to the start of the project, crews will be lowering manholes, lowering water meter valve covers and working on traffic signal lights with little disruption to traffic flow.

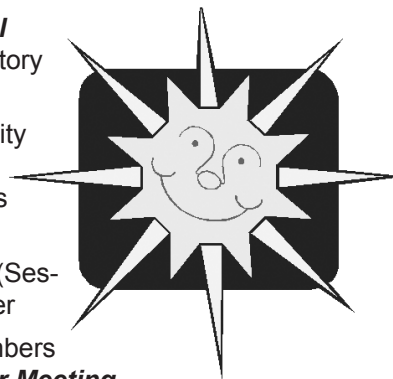

## Watch for "red flag conditions"

Despite this winter's moisture, we need to remember that as a forested community, Show Low annually faces the threat of wildfire. In March 2006, the City Council added emergency fire restrictions to the Show Low City Code. The change states that when the National Weather Service issues a "Red Flag Alert," the restrictions on open burning and smoking will automatically go into effect in the City. It means that no open outdoor fires, campfires, charcoal fires or outdoor smoking are permitted on either public or private property in the City. Outdoor cooking on stoves or grills, which use only propane, butane or other gases, is permitted.

Smoking is allowed within enclosed buildings and inside vehicles, in or on porches, carports, garages, parking lots and other areas or properties cleared of all combustible materials as long as the smoking does not create a substantial fire risk. Throwing or discarding lit cigarettes, cigars or other smoking materials from a vehicle or from one's possession out of doors is prohibited.

Violations that do not create a substantial risk of fire are civil, resulting in a fine. Violations that create a substantial risk of fire, or if anyone refuses to comply if ordered by a police officer, are class one misdemeanors, resulting in a fine and/or jail time.

The City will notify the public about "red flag conditions" via the electronic message board at Deuce of Clubs/Central Avenue intersection, the City's website, notices on City 4 Television and local radio announcements. Or, dial "593" on your telephone for fire weather and fire information.
